Quizzers Earn Four Badges in Four Years

This merit badge is to honor those in your Master Clubs that quiz as a representative of your church during the year. A Clubber may earn each of the four badges only once. Use the Scripture Memory Tracker at the end of each Ambassador Discipleship Guide (Bronze, Silver, and Gold) to see the list from Scripture Memory that will be used for each respective Crown Quiz at Regionals. Keep in mind also that when a quiz is given over any Crown, the first badge project is also included (Bible Study 1, 2, and 3).

Regionals Attendees

All of the Crown Quizzing is individual, but each church will enter various clubbers that will be representing their church. In essence, each church will then bring a "team" of boys and girls to represent them although points are only allotted per individual in the quizzing. If you are on your church's "team" and you compete in Regionals then you only need to participate to earn the badge. Your leader may have additional rules as to what will qualify you for the badge however. This decision is entirely up to your leaders – don't skip out on practice!

Non-Regionals Attendees

Sometimes, your distance from an official Master Clubs event does not allow your own church to attend. However, you can still earn the Bible Quiz badge. In this case, you must be prepared to quote 10 verses to your leader and answer correctly 5 questions about the Bible Study Badge (1, 2, or 3). Your leader can decide to give this information to you orally or in a written quiz. You may only have one "help" per verse, and you are not allowed to miss any of the 5 questions about the Bible Study Badge information.





2. Explain

Here is one test to discover if you are explaining your message clearly enough: when you give your conclusion, could you summarize your message in one sentence? Remember, "Easy to remember, harder to forget."



For example, if you use the verse "For the wages of sin is death," explaining the word "wages" would help your people to understand more clearly. You could say it like this, "Wages is what I get for what I do. So, the Bible is teaching us that what I get for my sin (the wages of sin) is death." Short, simple explanations help your listeners to understand. (Romans 6:23)

3. Illustrate

After reading the passage to your audience and explaining words in simple terms, now you help them understand the concepts even more by illustrating. Here are three types of illustrations:

A. Bible Illustration

Usually, there are one or more other Bible stories which teach the same principles.

B. Real-life Illustration

Read or think of someone recently to whom something happened that is relevant to your lesson.

C. Live Demonstration

Act out, in your message, the truths you are teaching.

4. Apply

The last part of your message is to apply the Bible toward the audience. In other words, what does this truth mean to them? Encourage your audience to ask themselves questions like these: Should I live or act that way? Am I living that way now? Do I need to change? Do I raise my hand? Should I go forward? Will someone help me? The preacher needs to direct each listener to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit. God can greatly use you to preach His wonderful Word!

"The Blessing of Yieldedness"

1 Kings 17:8-16

Throughout the Bible, God shows us that the blesses people who yield themselves to thim. Abraham yielded to God (Genesis 22): Gideon yielded to God (Judges 7:12): Hannah yielded to God (1 Samuel 1-3): and David yielded to God (1 Samuel 17:37, 45-46).

What does it mean to yield to God? It means this: what I want no longer matters; only God matters. A servant should be empty to his personal wants and be completely yielded to his master's needs. (cf. Luke 17:7-9)

If we will understand and apply these four truths about yielding ourselves to ${\sf God},$ we will experience the blessing of ${\sf God}$ in our lives.

- I. Realize that God wants us to yield to flim. ("I have commanded a widow woman" I Kings 17:9) If you do not yield to God, it will affect more than just you. If this woman had not yielded to God, her son would have died of hunger.
- 2. Realize God wants us to yield all we possess to flim. (I Kings 17:10-11) This woman was willing to fetch water for Elijah. But when he asked for her food (the last she possessed), she questioned his request. God wanted this woman to go a step beyond getting the water. He wanted her food too. Giving God all we possess takes faith.
- 3. Realize yielding myself to God is for this glory. (I kings 17:14) When we yield to God. He is not only able to show us how great the is: but the is also able to show the whole world how great the is (see Daniel 3:8-20, 28).
- 4. Realize that yielding myself to God is for my good. (I Kings 17:14-16) If she had fed herself first, her food would have been gone in one day: but because she gave it to God first, she was able to feed her family for three years. (cf. Luke 6:38)

In your life, what is the flour pot or cruse of oil that you are holding back from God? The ones who are willing to give their flour pot and cruse of oil to God will never lack God's provision in their lives—that's the blessing of yieldedness.


Being Safe on Your Bike

To earn the Bicycling merit badge, you must pass the three sections listed below: Bicycling Safety, Knowledge of Parts, and the Riding Test

Bicycling Safety

Study this section, and be ready to pass the Bicycle Safety quiz. Study especially the words in **BOLD TYPE**.

- Bicycles must **obey all regular automobile traffic laws**, including stop signs, traffic lights, and one-way streets. All other traffic signs must also be obeyed.
- **Use hand signs to indicate turning or stopping**. Study the same signs required by motorists. You must demonstrate these signs properly as your leader checks this section.



- Bicycles should be kept off busy streets. If used on sidewalks, pedestrians have the right of way.
- Keep right: **drive with traffic, not against it**. Ride your bike **single file** when riding with others.
- Watch for hazards. Keep your eyes alert for sand, gravel, pot holes, or other surface hazards.
- Watch out for turning cars and sudden stops. Walk your bike across busy intersections. Drive defensively (this means to be aware of what is going on around you).

- **Never be pulled** or towed by another vehicle.
- Stay off bikes at night time—that's the best idea. In most states you must use a headlight with a white light visible from at least 500 feet ahead. A red reflector should be visible from at least 50 to 300 feet behind when riding from sunset to sunrise or whenever visibility is poor.
- **Never ride double**. Most state laws forbid two people on one bike.
- Learn the laws on bike helmets in your state or province.



Your Club leader or a knowledgeable woodsman from your church will help to demonstrate the important features of building three types of fires for use in outdoor camps.

Fire-Building Information

Fire-building is an ART that must be learned. And as such, there are certain basics you must learn before going out into the woods. Read over all of the information below. You will be tested over it in the Requirements Section.

Gathering Materials for Your Fire

There are three types of materials you will need to collect to have a good start for your fire.

Tinder: Tinder is very light wood which will flare up easily when you touch it with a match. Gather a good handful before starting. This material could be very thin pieces of bark (never green or growing bark—never strip off bark). Small twigs can be found around trees, dry grass, weeds, leaves, or anything that is dry and small. Never use gasoline to start a fire.

Kindling: Kindling is small, dry sticks used to catch the rising flames from your tinder. Never use green wood or strip limbs off any tree still growing. The ground usually holds enough dead wood for any fire. Green wood will only bend, while dead wood will "snap" when broken into shorter pieces.

Fuel: For fuel, use whatever larger pieces of wood you find from fallen trees or broken limbs. Break it into pieces 12 to 18 inches long. Wood from pine trees will burn but will usually have excessive smoke. Seek to use hardwood for your camp fire, such as oak, maple, birch, or ash.

Making Your Fire

The first thing to remember is "Safety First." Clear a circular area of about 10 feet around on all sides of your fire pit. Make sure there are no overhanging branches from trees that might catch on fire. Now, determine what kind of fire you need. Campers have a slogan for the kind of fire needed for cooking: "FLAMES FOR BOILING—COALS FOR BROILING."



Three Basic Types of Fire Lays

one or two handfuls of tinder in the very center spot for your fire. With the "kindling" sticks you have now gathered, form sticks (with a small portion sticking into the ground) as if you are making a small teepee. The sticks come together at the top, as they lean into each other. Keep it in close so that the tinder will burn the teepee sticks quickly. Once these flare up, add larger sticks until a good flame is going, then you are ready to lay larger wood flat on the fire.

2. Rock Fireplace: Three or four large rocks form the ring for this fire, leaving a center "nesting" area for your fire. This is a good fire for cooking, with pans having a rock to lean on. Your Club leader should help you to decide upon the proper rocks. A word of caution: your fire must touch only the corner of the large rocks. Rocks explode when they are placed on or in a very hot fire. Do not use small rocks near a fire.

logs are placed side by side to form a resting place for this fire. These logs are large enough that it would take your campfire a long time to ignite them. Thus, you can use the logs to hold your pan or skillet over the fire. You will often need the help of an axe or saw to form the right length of log. The two open ends allow oxygen to reach your fire.

Hiking Information

Foot Care

Hiking can be a fun or a miserable experience, depending upon the condition of your feet. So wash your feet at least once a day, and use foot powder to control irritations. Be sure that your toenails are well trimmed before starting on a hike. Wear clean socks and well "broken-in" shoes. In the weeks before, take small hikes around the neighborhood, increasing the length each day. This helps toughen your feet before the long hike. Remember, most feet are not conditioned for long, extended walking. Feet are actually tender unless toughened by long walks. Socks should fit perfectly. If too long, they will wrinkle and rub. If too short, they will bind and cramp your toes. Holes in toes or heels will allow sores to begin quickly. On long hikes, you should always carry a second pair of socks. Use the tops of socks to wipe moisture from your feet. It is equally important that your shoes fit well too. If too big, blisters will occur. If too small, your feet will cramp.

Time and Distance

A very good hiker can travel 20 miles in a day. A few experienced hikers can travel 30 or more miles a day. If you only hike occasionally, those distances should not even be considered as your goal. It takes 6 hours and 40 minutes to walk 20 miles a day and that is at a very brisk pace. That means no time out for lunch, resting, or enjoying the scenery. So for most of us, a 5-10 mile hike is plenty, and it will be enjoyable. Your watch can measure the miles: 3 miles in one hour, 1 mile in 20 minutes, and 1/2 mile in 10 minutes. It takes about 1 hour and 40 minutes to hike 5 miles away; and remember, it takes the same to return.

Always make sure others know where you are going and when you intend to return, because accidents do happen. Never hike alone.

Safety

Always keep away from railroads and highways. When you must be on a road for a while, hike single file along the left shoulder, hiking towards the oncoming traffic. If a night hike is necessary, use flashlights, and/or tie a white handkerchief around your leg.

Hitchhiking should never be an option for you. That is extremely dangerous. You do not want to be in a car or truck with someone who has been driving around looking for someone like you.

If caught in a thunderstorm, never seek shelter beneath a large tree. Do not stay on a hilltop. Do not hide under a bank of mud and rocks which may slide when heavy rains come down. You must also avoid areas like these where lightning may strike. A dense area of woods, groves of young trees or ditches and ravines are some of the "safer" places to wait out an intense storm.
